A Message from South Sudan

Lukas, our country coordinator from South Sudan sent in another moving testimony. "Evangelist Hassen is one of the Nubian young man whom I mentored some yevars back in kakuma refugee camp and later he left to Khartoum. In his statement Hassen after reading the book of Romans 12:14, he said that part was a challenge to his life and God touch him to be a person that can pay with Good even those who persecute you. He said he met one of the Arab man who one day persecuted their family where every Sunday he could come with some Arab soldier to intimidate them. He said he never had a

heart to forgive because his father was slaughtered by this group. But the day God spoke to him through this chapter after repeating reading, the huge power of revenge he has been holding in his heart disappeared. Hassen spoke with through messenger and says we really serve a powerful God. I (Luka) was so moved with this powerful testimony."
