Happy 2021! The Lord has truly been blessing the work of RP, and I am excited to get to share that with you today.

Charles Naibei, our facilitator in Kenya wrote that he is encouraged by the fact that during the 2020 calendar year, 255 pastors in total completed the Romans Challenge! Due to COVID restrictions making it challenging to hold graduation ceremonies, at this point, only 120 of those have received their device with sermons. The other 135 are eagerly awaiting their devices.

He says that most of the pastors who completed the Romans Challenge have changed their style of preaching because of the time they spent abiding in the Word of God. Pray that God will give them inner revelation as they minister in their various churches.

Achine in Cameroon shared with us that he was able to recruit 14 pastors from a region of the country that had not previously heard of RP.

Join us in praying that these fourteen church leaders will be

blessed by the time they spend reading and writing the Word of God and that through them we will be able to reach many other pastors in their region of Cameroon as well.



As Covid restrictions continue to make it challenging to hold graduation celebrations in Zambia, Zinga celebrated Pastor Kalombola's graduation in a car. When he received the device with sermons, Pastor Kalombola said he had received something precious. He is excited to tell his friends and encourage them to take on the Romans Challenge as well.

In Burkina Faso, an RP participant, Mr. Bonkougou said that transcribing the book of Romans helped him understand that salvation comes through grace. Once we are saved, it is also

important to demonstrate our faith through our works.

In December of 2020, Lukas, our facilitator in South Sudan, studied the book of Ephesians using the method of Romans Challenge where he read it 20 times and wrote it out by hand once. Lukas was then given the opportunity to preach from Ephesians on the state radio. From this, he is aware of 8 people who dedicated their lives to Christ!

Praise God for using Lukas to reach people with the Word of God.

Kenosi in Botswana shared with us the story of Pastor Jones. Pastor Jones said that the writing out of the book of Romans helped him slow down and take time to understand what the Word of God is saying. This discipline has transferred into the way he now prepares sermons. Previously he would rush through sermon preparation, but now he takes time to study and understand the passage of Scripture he is teaching from.
