Zimbabwe Trip Report

We reported last month that Pastor Gary Dozier was headed to Zimbabwe, Africa to join with Lovemore Musiyiwa, the Zimbabwe National Facilitator, and Zinga Banda, the Zambia National Facilitator, to hold three pastors conferences. The main objective of these conferences was to teach, equip, and invite pastors in Zimbabwe to join the Romans Project. The total attendance expected for all three gatherings was 550 pastors, and 1,089 pastors attended!

Gary added that at the second of these three conferences in Harare there were 600 pastors in attendance, squeezing into a room with a capacity of 350, greatly exceeding their expectations! Gary also shared how he brought over 1,000 digital devices with him from the USA intended for several Africa facilitators who needed them for upcoming commissionings. Going through customs, Gary was stopped and questioned about the devices. Customs determined that Gary needed to pay a tax on the devices an exorbitant amount that Gary was not prepared to pay. After much back and forth discussion, Gary decided to ask the man if he was a Christian. When the man said that he was,

Gary asked him, "Are you really going to deny these pastors this teaching?" That was the end of the discussion. He was allowed to go through with all the devices. Gary said that this was the most players he has taken at one time, and the first time he has not had to pay a tax on them!

Praise God who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think! Please pray for Lovemore who reported that March was one of his busiest months. Pray for good follow-up with the pastors who attended these conferences, that they will accept and complete the Romans Challenge.

Botswana Update

Botswana National Facilitator, Kenosi Molato, has such a desire to see the Romans Project grow and reach more pastors in more countries, that he has been busy making inroads into neighboring countries: Mozambique, South Africa, Lesotho, and Namibia, that are yet to open to the Romans Project.



Kenosi is actively seeking and challenging faithful pastors in each of these four countries. He first invites them to do the Romans Challenge themselves so that they will be qualified to serve as a national

facilitator. Completion of the Romans Challenge allows a potential facilitator to experience personally the impact the Romans Challenge has on the life and ministry of a pastor, and enables them to testify of its transforming power to other pastors they invite.

In addition, Kenosi also continues to lead the RP in Botswana, commissioning 66 pastors and inviting 16 more so far this year. In his latest report, Kenosi expressed appreciation for two of his regional men in Botswana, Pastor Mogomotsi and Pastor Tebo who have been instrumental to him.

Please pray for Pastor Masango in Mozambique and Pastor Nonyane in South Africa as they take the first step of the Romans Challenge. Please pray for wisdom for the RP leaders as they consider these men as potential national facilitators. Pray also for the Lord to give wisdom to Kenosi in his search for potential facilitators for Lesotho and Namibia.

Before encountering the Romans Project, I found the book of Romans difficult to understand. But thanks to this program, I fell in love with the epistle. It now seems to me the richest book in the New Testament. Every time we read it we discover new wealth there.
