Nepal Country Opening

Pastors in Nepal have expressed a desire to have RP made available to them as well. Much like the other countries we have a presence in, the church in Nepal also faces the challenge of pastors who do not have access to training. Very few Nepalese pastors are able to attend Seminary or other forms of Biblical training prior to taking on the pastorship of a congregation. We would love to be able to offer them the training of the Romans Challenge and the resource provided through the devices with hundreds of sermons.

In order for RP to be established in Nepal, we will need to find a facilitator to direct the ministry within Nepal. There is one pastor we have been connected with recently who we believe may be a good fit to take on this role. It will take some time to build a relationship with him, equip him with the necessary tools, and help him launch RP in Nepal.

Praise God for a country with pastors who are hungry for Biblical Equipping. Please pray for discernment in the process of opening a new country.

A Facilitator in Nigeria

Romans Series Translation

Another hope for this upcoming year is to see the Romans Series (an 18 sermon overview of the book of Romans) translated into Arabic and Moorè. Arabic has been requested by Lukas in South Sudan, as it is a widely spoken language there. Moorè is a language spoken by over 16 million in Burkina Faso, as well as regions within several other countries.
