



Francophone Africa Field Visits

On Sunday, February 18, Pastor Carl, Romans Project International Director, will embark on a journey to west Africa. There he will join with Simon Ramdé, International Director of Francophone Africa, for field visits to Ivory Coast, Guinea and Togo. This will be the first time for a director or a board member to have boots on the ground in these three countries that opened up in 2022. Simon will also visit Mali.

Their time in each country will be spent attending invitation and commissioning gatherings, meeting with the national facilitators and their regional men, and encouraging them in the expansion work of the RP to more regions and to more pastors. Simon has also made arrangements for himself and Carl to meet with leaders of Christian denominations and fraternals in order to share the vision of the Romans Project. To have these leaders of pastors acknowledge the value of the RP challenge and the positive impact that abiding in Romans makes in the lives of pastors and their congregations will be a valuable endorsement for the RP.

Please pray for Carl's time with Simon and for success in all they hope to accomplish. Please pray for Matthieu, the French-English translator that will accompany them, to be a great help as they communicate with one another, and engage with the French speaking pastors and leaders.

Gabon Is Open!

The African country of Gabon is now open to the Romans Project with Jean François Mbandza as the first National Facilitator.
