They told Arthur that the reason they wanted him to come in person is because they were concerned that the Romans Project was some new religion. "There are many people coming up with all sorts of teachings that are not biblical," they said. They were fed up with their false teaching and did not want them in their areas. Praise God for this small group of believers who are spiritually discerning and only want the true word of God proclaimed! One of the pastors asked Arthur if he could go to Kyela town next. There are over 15 pastors there that he wants to hear about the Romans Project.

Report from Botswana

Kenosi Moalato, the Romans Project Botswana National Facilitator, asks for prayer for religious freedom in Botswana. He reports that the government of Botswana has implemented a new law which requires that all churches register as Societies, and for a church to be able to register, it must have at least 150 members. Kenosi says, "This has caused a religious turmoil in the country."

While this new law is very concerning to believers in Botswana, Kenosi has continued to see the Romans Project grow as pastors who have completed the RP Challenge go on to challenge other pastors and church leaders. Just in the

month of June, 35 pastors and church leaders have begun the reading of Romans.

Pray that the churches in Botswana, especially the ones with smaller congregations, can continue to gather lawfully.
