Abel also shared how many pastors in the north are doing the Romans Project together - literally. They meet together in small groups and read "Romans Out Loud Together" (ROLT). They still fulfill the requirement of reading it 20 times, they just

read it together as a group, and afterward they copy it out individually. This method is spurring many on to complete the Challenge!

## Report from Rwanda

Justin Birangwa, the Country Facilitator in Rwanda attended an event in Musanze recently, where he met with pastors and explained about the Romans Project. Six pastors accepted to take the RP initial challenge.

Justin was also able to meet with three pastors who are RP graduates. He expressed how it was "a great joy to meet with them again where I encouraged them to multiply themselves." (All graduates are exhorted to tell others about the RP Challenge and thereby multiply the number of pastors and church leaders who participate.)

There are presently 54 other pastors that Justin stays in touch with and encourages to complete the RP Challenge. Most of them are still in the reading phase, but two men, Rev. Alexandre and Pastor Zamani Pierre just completed the Challenge. Zamani told Justin that he has four more pastors who want to start!

Sadly there are some who are finding themselves too busy with other obligations to complete the Challenge. Justin encouraged one such pastor by reminding him of the beauty of abiding in God's word.

Pray for God to help Justin be an encouragement to the pastors he tells about the RP, and to those he leads through the Challenge.
