Madagascar Report

In March of this year, the Romans Project welcomed Mamy Rasolofondrainibe, as the new National Facilitator for Madagascar. In just the first month as Facilitator, Mamy had the opportunity to share about the Romans Project with pastors and church leaders at several churches, with missionaries in training, and with seminary students. Most who heard accepted the Romans Challenge and have already started the reading. In total, seventy new challengers have begun the reading of Romans since Madagascar opened in March.

Mamy had this to say about his experience so far, "From these first experiences of sharing the RP with pastors and leaders, I'm very encouraged by the fact that they are very interested in the reading after understanding its benefits, even though reading and writing are hard tasks to achieve for Malagasy people due to the oral culture we are in. However, while it seems that it is easy for me to challenge them, I understand that it is the Holy Spirit moving in them. Most of them are already in between their 4th to 18th times of reading now, since the beginning of April."

One church leader, Haingo Andriamirado, gave his testimony after completing the reading, saying that reading Romans 20 times changed his life, and his tight relationship with God has been restored. He decided to keep reading and has now read Romans 24 times.

Mamy has more scheduled opportunities in May to present the Romans Project. He is also looking forward to hosting Ken Onywoki, RP Africa National Director, and Gary Dozier, RP Director of Ministry, in Madagascar for a conference June 22-25. Three hundred pastors and leaders have been invited to come hear them present the Romans Project.

Please pray for Mamy and this newly opened country, for the Holy Spirit to continue to move in pastors and church leaders to accept the Challenge. Pray also for all the preparations for the conference in June.
