Haiti

Dan Wanvig, SWBIBLE Global Outreach worker, and the first **Romans Project National** Facilitator for the recently opened country of Haiti, reported in his update, "I knew I wanted to see the Romans Project come to Haiti, but I wasn't sure how to get it started. I found out that the main hurdle would be finding a translator who could translate the materials and teaching from English to Haitian Creole. I mentioned that to a new friend of mine here, and he got excited. He used to translate materials for a seminary and has a full recording studio - and he's fluent in English, French, and Creole!"

Burkina Faso

Lankoandé Amasaï, National Facilitator for Burkina Faso, reported that there are 1,116 people currently engaged in the Romans Challenge in Burkina. Lankoandé is monitoring their progress and providing encouragement to many of these participants through 16 WhatsApp groups, and more groups are still being formed.

Lankoandé also told of his great surprise in learning that seven people from Gayeri in Komondjari Province finished the reading and transcription of Romans while in the grip of insecurity and persecution. (Christians had been killed while they were at church in 2021.) Lankoandé marveled at how he had not even been to this locality yet to talk about the Romans Project!

We give thanks to God for His work in spreading the Romans Project throughout the provinces of Burkina Faso.

Philippines

Especially hard-hit during the pandemic, it is such a joy to see the Philippines emerging out of COVID, and the Romans Project beginning to flourish there again. In October, Southeast Asia International Director Cesar Tallada, along with SWBIBLE GO Worker Edmir Miranda, and RP coordinators Ramon Borja and Dr Rick Trinidad, held a gathering in Palauig where they challenged 36 pastors and church leaders representing two provinces, Zambales and Bataan. During this day-long gathering, the group was introduced to the Romans Project, were taught from the book of Romans, then spent time reading through Romans aloud together and transcribing chapter one.
