

Report from Sierra Leone Alpha Samuels began his recent report giving praise and glory to God for helping him as he challenged pastors and church leaders to see the significance of taking and telling others about the Romans Project.



RP Gathering in Sierra Leone

Alpha reported that by God's grace he had the opportunity to have RP gatherings in two Districts in Sierra Leone in April. These events attracted roughly 160 pastors and church leaders.

At the gathering in Moyamba Town, in southern Sierra Leone, 30 pastors and 20 church leaders started the initial challenge, and 35 pastors and 15 church leaders who had completed the challenge, received their Mp3 players and SD card.

At the gathering in Mile 91 Town, Tonkolili District, in northern Sierra Leone 24 pastors and 11 church leaders started the initial challenge, and 15 pastors and 10 church leaders who completed the challenge, received their Mp3 players and SD card.

Alpha remarked, "They were great gatherings. The pastors were in high spirit in receiving the Mp3 players and SD cards as they said 'this would ease our study of God's Word, open/ broaden our understanding of certain books and subjects in The Bible and also help us prepare better sermons'".
