As mentioned in a previous newsletter, there are several countries where the Romans Project is advancing and making an impact in the lives of pastors and their congregations. But for security reasons, we are unable to mention these countries by name in our newsletters. One of these high-risk regions is in South Asia. Despite the risk of persecution to the facilitators and pastors in this region, we have seen God raising up new facilitators and opening new areas to the RP on a regular basis.

One facilitator from this region who follows up regularly through WhatsApp with pastors who are engaged in the Challenge, shared this in his report: "I am so glad that the Lord has been doing great things through this RP Challenge in our region." He went on to report that 15 pastors had accepted the RP Challenge at a gathering held earlier that month.

of the Lord and persevere in sharing about the Romans Project with their fellow pastors. Please pray for the Lord's protection over them and their families.
